Snow Sculpture

Build a snow sculpture – something different to your typical snowman. A dog, a cat, a house! Let your imagination run wild. Discuss techniques for impacting the snow, the different types of snow and what works and what doesn't.



Ice Sculptures

Take some balloons and fill them with water and food colouring. Place in the snow all day and overnight.

The next day peel off the balloon and you've got a readymade ice sculpture! Chip away until you've got a shape you want or leave as they are. Fun!

Winter Walk

Go for a winter walk, look for animal prints and try to identify what sort of animal made each mark. Use this Winter check list – print it out and take it with you. Tick off what you see along the way.

Snow Graffiti

Fill spray bottles with water that's been tinted with food colours. Decorate the white snow with your own colourful design. There's no better canvas than a blanket of fresh snow!



Noughts and Crosses

Play an enormous game of noughts and crosses in the snow. Either draw directly into the snow with a stick or use pine cones for the "O" and crossed sticks for the "X."
