Curricular Areas

Numeracy:

In Numeracy, we will be consolidating our knowledge of the four operations (+, -, x, ÷) and applying this to problem solving activities. We will also be further developing skill in Data Handling, Time and Measurement. Learning will continue to be applied to real-life contexts.

Literacy:

In Literacy, we will continue to develop our use of vocabulary, connectives, openers and punctuation throughout our Big Writing lessons. Our writing focus this term will be imaginative stories.

We will continue to embed Active Reading strategies through novel studies. Our class novel this term is Stormbreaker by Anthony Horowitz. Children are also encouraged to read for enjoyment at home.

Health and Wellbeing:

This term, all Primary 6 pupils will take part in Bikeability. They will have the opportunity to develop their knowledge of road safety and will put this into practice during practical lessons around the roads of Portlethen.

All pupils will also take part in a series of living and growing lessons; the focus for P6 is to develop knowledge of how life begins and the role of a parent/carer.

Interdisciplinary Learning:

This term, the class have chosen to learn about Spain. They will learn about Spanish towns and cities, Spanish culture, weather and climate and they will learn some Spanish phrases and greetings. Throughout this topic they will have the chance to engage in a range of activities; undertaking research, creating videos and tourist guides as well as to develop their language skills. They will also make a comparison between life in Scotland with that in Spain.
